	confirmation mail is used to check whether the owner of the email
	address as the data subject has authorised receipt of the newsletter.
	When you register for the newsletter we also store the IP address of
	the computer system used at the time of registration and issued by
	the Internet service provider (ISP), together with the date and time of
	registration. Collection of these data is required to enable us to re-
	trace a (potential) misuse of the email address at a later date; it there-
	fore serves as a legal safeguard.

Data subject rights:	You have the right of access pursuant to Article 15 GDPR, the right to rectification pursuant to 16 GDPR, the right to erasure pursuant to Article 17 GDPR, the right to restriction of processing pursuant to Article 18 GDPR, the right to object arising from Article 21 GDPR and the right to data portability arising from Article 20 GDPR. With regard to the right of access and the right to erasure, the restrictions pursuant to Sections 34 and 35 of the German Federal Data Protection Act (BDSG) apply. In addition, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a competent data protection supervisory authority (Article 77 GDPR in conjunction with Section 19 BDSG).
